Goal and Objectives

## Learning Goal

- The VBS Teen Crew Learning Goal will be to:
  - Know that Life is Wild and God is Good through learning how to lead in Army Chapel programs.

## Learning Objectives

- The Learning Objectives to accomplish the goal are:
  - Learning Chapel Sanctuary Audio/Visual system. (Understanding)
    - Showing the system use (teen who knows the system already)
    - Interpreting how to use each piece of the equipment (Teens who are new to the system)
    - Illustrating the system by building an Audio/visual use guide which includes photos of the system and photo/word instructions.
    - The success of this objective will be measured by an adult testing the instructions.
  - Constructing Chapel welcome communications. (Creating)
    - Organizing welcome/registration table.
    - Discussing USAG Stuttgart chapel programs with participants.
    - Compiling Attendance rosters into reports to include Storyboard, Newspaper article, and statistical reports.
    - Choosing to use of Key VBS themes in conversations with adult and child participants.
    - The success of this objective will be measured by participant evaluations and acceptance of compiled reports/articles for use by USAG Stuttgart Chaplain's Office.
  - Utilize principles of Chapel Logistics (Applying)
    - Selecting correct materials for setting up and cleaning up VBS program elements.
    - Solving new challenges that Adult Facilitators introduce to the teens.

### Teen Crew Qualifications

#### Adult Facilitators:

- Hold a key role in VBS program
- Experience working with teenagers
- Understanding of tasks, objectives, and goals

#### Teen Participants:

- No child protection background check required
- Willingness to work toward the identified goal
- Commitment to accomplishing the objectives

### Teen Crew Benefits

- VBS Teen Crew Members are eligible to eat volunteer snacks instead of child Crew Snacks.
- Successful completion of the VBS Teen Crew could earn the participant:
  - Certificate of Appreciation
  - Credit for Volunteer service hours
  - Letter of recommendation from Religious Education Program Director or USAG Stuttgart Garrison Chaplain

#### Teen Crew Schedule & Activities

- Arrive at least 15 minutes before the start of VBS each day; check in at the Registration Table
- Stay at least 15 minutes after VBS each day; Checkout at the Registration Table
- Instead of VBS Crew rotations; the VBS Crew members will work flexibly as the VBS program needs change and rooms/equipment are available.
- The activities to accomplish goals will be decided upon in conversations between adult and teen participants.

### Teen Crew Rules

#### Adult Facilitators:

- Work within the position description of a VBS Leader
- Comply with Army Chaplain Corps Child Protection Standards

#### Teen Participants:

- Stay with the group & 2 leaders at all times; wearing Teen Crew name badge.
- Listen to instructions of Adult Facilitators and other designated Adult VBS Leaders
- Do not do anything to hurt anyone else, including God.
- Consequences are:
  - 1. Warning
  - 2. Time away from the activities to discuss the situation with an adult facilitator
  - Removal from the Crew; meeting with VBS Director; and notification to Parents
