1. Put it in a large ziplock bag so then it can go into anything else you have (purse, backpack, bag, whatever).
2. It has a pocket sized New Testament, a little booklet of blank white paper (for notes, or drawing, or journaling, etc.), a small Rubics cube, a couple of squishy toys (ball-like fish and foam Hello Kittie), and some fidget toys (a fidget cube and a couple fidget "sleeves" that have a ball inside a mesh fabric to be "smooshed" back and forth). We would add a small box of colored pencils (because crayons melt and break easier) and a small manual pencil sharpener.

1. In the Pew Pal supply bag, a good idea might be to have holy cards or other religious picture books. This way the children can be entertained while keeping them focused on the Lord. Then, they start to develop an understanding that time on Sunday is a time to focus on the Lord. Another religious item that could go in the supply bag is a children's rosary.
2. I think a booklet that explains the Mass and other activities related to the Scripture reading is perfect. This can include word searches, crossword puzzles, coloring books, etc. (This would have to be adjusted to the child's age.) Also, sensory items are great!
