Family Share Time

■ Materials

- A construction paper mat frame
- Strips of colored paper to weave into mat

■ Activity


- Divide the colored strips of paper between family members.
- On each strip write words describing a simple “gift” that one member of your family could give to another member. The words could be “a hug” or “a helping hand with the dishes” or “story time.” Let these gifts be words and actions that you can share. Ask young children, “Tell me something nice that you could do or say to someone in the family that would make them feel good.”
- Take turns sharing your gift ideas and weaving the strips into the frame.

■ I Invite You to Share

- Discuss as a family how and when you will use your Gift Mat between now and Christmas.
 - For example, maybe every morning, one strip could be pulled from the Gift Mat and that gift could be given to someone in the family.

■ Materials

■ Activity

 - ❑ Cut and decorate cookies.
 - ❑ Place on your family's baking tray.
 - ❑ Deliver tray to the kitchen where cookies will be baked during supper.

 - While you are dividing and sharing your food, servers will come to your table with pitchers of milk and water.
