Administrative Information

EVALUATION: The student is required to fully engage in lesson by applying critical and creative thinking throughout the lesson as well as completing all assignments.







All chapel RE programs are encouraged to have JOURNALS.


Have each participant fold some blank paper inside a sheet of construction paper, stapling to make a journal.


Explicit lesson of Journals is the spiritual discipline of Journalling – linking CC to "big church" to weeklong faith


Implicit lesson of Journals is the stewardship of reusing materials rather than repurchasing 1 way to include Journal in CC – have children write or paste the day's Bible verse and a challenge for the week into their journal. The children take home the journal and write/color how they do their week's challenge. When they return next week, they use the journals to show and tell how they served/worshiped/studied about God during the week. 1 other way to include Journal in CC – keep the journals in CC and add to them each week for a month. Send home the journals to show the parents what they learned in the week. Think about your CC participants. What would work best with them













































Training specifically designed for dealing with Toxic People will be held on 3 November 2019.

Parenting in the Pew will be 8 December 2019. Be thinking about best practices and great ideas for children in chapel.


