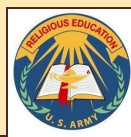
To qualify for credentialing as an Army religious educator, the candidate must meet minimum qualification requirements.

These educators conduct programs and processes while providing opportunities and venues to foster healthy spiritual growth and faith sustainment.
